The Italian American Veterans Museum and Library is a permanent, high-quality, aesthetic, scholarly and educational collection that explores our unique contributions to the security of the United States and shares those contributions with the public at large.

The museum gathers, catalogs, restores and archives military artifacts and wartime memorabilia. In addition to permanent and changing displays, the museum contains interactive and other electronic exhibits, a database of videotaped oral histories, and a library. Future projects include a traveling exhibit, public programs, a documentary and other educational initiatives.
