The Italian American Veterans Museum will host a screening of the acclaimed PBS documentary "A City at War: Chicago" featuring a discussion led by one of the film's contributors. Retired Navy Commander Joseph Troiani will give a PowerPoint presentation and field questions before the screening.

When President Franklin Roosevelt urged America to become "an arsenal for democracy" in the buildup to World War II, Chicago answered the call, becoming a well-oiled production machine. Narrated by legendary journalist Bill Kurtis, "A City at War" is a comprehensive account of the Windy City's involvement in the war effort. The one-hour documentary was aired on more than 100 public television stations across the country.

The museum will be open at 6:30 p.m. with light refreshments available, and the presentation will begin at 7 p.m. sharp. Admission is free, but donations are welcome, and **RESERVATIONS ARE A MUST**.
